Collection Corner

Dial 1 For Sumter: Telephone Manufacturing in Sumter County By Leeam Stein, Collections Assistant

While today it is difficult to find electronics and technology manufacturing in South Carolina, that wasn't always the case. The Sumter Telephone Manufacturing Co. was formed in 1899 by Charles T. Mason Jr, who at first had been an inventor of cotton harvesting machinery. Mason's knowledge and interest in communications technology came from his father, Charles T. Mason Sr who operated telegraph communications for the Confederate States during the Civil War and manufactured telegraphic parts along with being a watchmaker and jeweler. After only a year in operation, the Sumter Telephone Manufacturing Co. was considered



one of the most advanced and largest telephone manufacturers in the country. On Harvin Street in what is today the James E. Clyburn Transportation Center, their main factory built everything from switchboards and the telephone apparatus to spare parts. The company sourced all the wood parts for its telephones from local oak trees, making their pieces quite the luxury for any home. The company was ultimately sold to a subsidiary of AT&T in 1910 as Charles Mason ventured into new businesses, and the company folded completely in 1929 at the onset of the Great Depression.
